Dear Tom:

It was a pleasure to meet you in Pocatello last week. Your efforts on our behalf were greatly appreciated. You are a true credit to the Pocatello community, and I appreciate all the help which you gave us.

As we discussed, Dal-Tile has been in the tile business for over forty years. As the largest tile manufacturer in the Western Hemisphere, there is not much that goes on in our industry that we don't know about. Shortly after Ceratile began operations, we became aware of the role which Pocatello Development Authority had played in their location decisions. Now that the opportunity has become ours, the tax increment financing program has become critical for our decisions.

Tom, we anticipate should we be successful in purchasing the equipment, within three months we would have approximately forty employees, and an annual payroll of approximately \$600,000.
