Dear Kendall:

We are in receipt of your letter to Dan Sharp dated May 1, 2002, regarding the PVC pipe on the referenced project. We understand that the price of PVC pipe may fluctuate. However in section 2.01 of the bid form it states that, "The bid will remain subject to acceptance for 60 days after the bid opening,..." Your notice of award is dated April 22, 2002 and was delivered to HK, with the unsigned contracts the same day. Also your contract states that you will provide and assume full responsibility for all materials necessary to complete the work (General Condition paragraph 6.03.A). Paragraph 6.06.C of the General Conditions identifies additional contractual responsibility concerning this issue. Based on the information you provided in your letter, we can not accept the request for a change order to compensate you for the increase in PVC pipe price due to no fault of the Owner, PDA. You have signed a contract to complete the project in 90 days from the Notice to Proceed date. The Notice to Proceed date is still yet to be determined. The contract does allow this date to be up to 30 days after the effective date of the agreement.

We cannot advise you on how to proceed since neither the Owner nor the Engineer can direct the method or means to accomplish the tasks you agreed to complete. By this letter, we are advising PDA and the City of your request.

HK Contractors has been notified by our supplier that the price for the PVC pipe has increased since the bid date on February 28, 2002. The delivery date is also 12 weeks out from the order date. A replacement pipe has been located that meets and exceeds the project's specifications. This pipe, a 30" 32.5 CL125 PVC pipe, is available now if ordered soon.

The original quote for the 30" C905 pipe is \$26.52 per lf.

The increased price for the 30" C905 is \$33.79 per lf (12 weeks out).

The price of the available 30" CL125 pipe is currently at \$46.14 per lf. if order soon.

On February 28, 2002, we quoted this project using a price from one of our manufacturers. Pipe manufacturers will only guarantee prices for a short time, 30 days is the standard.

If the pipe would have been ordered by March 28, 2002, delivery could have been around the first of May at the same cost. Since the quote of this project, PVC prices have risen significantly. This also causes problems with production.

There is a 30" pipe that we have found that will meet and exceed the specification. This pipe is available now. It is a higher-pressure pipe and will work on this project. The cost also exceeds the price of the specified pipe. All of the manufacturers we have spoken with have raised the price on the specified pipe and delivery is around 12 weeks from the order date; since this is an uncommon type of pipe that pipe manufacturers only produce on an as needed basis. This makes for an extended delivery.

We have received your letter dated May 8, 2002 regarding your 30-inch C905 PVC pipe cost. It was stated in your bid proposal that HK would honor their bid for 60 days after the bid opening. We and the Owner did not know of your 30-day price lock on the PVC pipe during the 60-day period allowed by the Owner to determine award. The Notice of Award was delivered to HK Contractors with unsigned contracts within the 60-day period. We cannot release you from your responsibility to honor your bid for 60 days. The PDA Board has many items to consider when awarding projects. As you know, there was some concern with the bids regarding the low bidder. You were awarded the bid within the agreed upon time. PDA has no control over the fluctuating cost of PVC pipe nor the inconsistencies in the bids. We do not have control of your suppliers nor did we influence your bid. We have denied your request because we feel that the PDA Board nor the City should be held responsible for the extra cost of the pipe.

Please proceed with purchasing the pipe and installing it as agreed in your contract. We look forward to completing this work on time and within the agreed budget.

Dear Paul,

This letter is in response to your letter dated May 2, 2002 denying any compensation for the increased price for the 30" C905 PVC Water Pipe.

It is a standard policy for suppliers to guarantee their quotes on materials for 30 days after a bid opening. This time period has not been a concern in the past due to the fact that most Notice of Awards are issued with in a 30-day time frame.

This project bid on February 28, 2002 and the unsigned copies of the Notice of Award were delivered to HK Contractors on April 22, 2002. We requested submittal aformation from our suppliers at that time. Our PVC supplier came to us on Monday April 29, 2002 and informed us that the 30" C905 PVC Pipe was out 12 weeks on an order. They also informed us that due to the radical PVC (petroleum) Market, the price for the 30" pipe had gone up considerably. The time lapse from the bid date to when we received the information on the PVC Pipe availability was 61 days.

HK Contractors has tried to respond in a timely manner to get this project going. We do not feel like we should be held responsible for the extra cost in the PVC Pipe. We did not have any control in the length of time it took to get the job awarded, nor did we waste any time getting our paper work in line once the Notice of Award finally came.

The class of PVC Pipe that was specified for this project is not a common stock item due to its size and class of pipe. I believe Schiess & Associates was aware of this problem at the time the job was bid. We would hope that because of these circumstances you will help us in this matter and support the request that we have made to be compensated for the extra cost of the pipe.

HK Contractors is working through you, the Engineer. We do not feel like we should have to go before PDA to fight for something that we had no control over.

As requested, we have prepared a justification for additional engineering fees associated with our contract dated June 22, 2000 for Phase I, Construction Services. We are requesting additional fees for the additional work required because of the time extensions granted to the Contractor.

The contract states that our work will be done by November 2001. The agreement with the Contractor states a completion date of January 7, 2002. Since signing that contract the PDA Board has approved time extensions of 140 days to the Contractor. This time extension was primarily to assure streets were paved through the winter. This change can also be attributed to the fact that the Contractor did not get additional crews in the summer of 2001 as planned and did not complete the work as agreed. As stated in our agreement, we are to provide resident project engineering and the tasks associated with construction oversight services. Our work consists of ensuring that the work is complete as outlined in the approved plans and specifications. We do not direct the work. This means we must be on site when the Contractor is working. The time extensions granted to the Contractor were not anticipated at the time the contract was signed, and we have no control over how the Contractor completes the work. Since the contract has been extended, we have to be on the job longer to protect you. As we have been informing you for the last few months, the "not to exceed" budget is exhausted.

Knowing that we were going to exceed the budget because of the above noted change in the project, we began to inform you of the change in our scope in October 2001. Since then, we have continued to work providing resident project engineering services as requested by the City and PDA.

As requested on several occasions by the PDA Board, we have tried to preserve our budget, however with an extension of 140 days and increasing HK's contract by over \$500,000, we have had to spend extra time to protect the City's interests. These changes were not anticipated. They are an unforeseen condition. We have no control over the Contractor and have simply been working as requested.

Therefore, we feel we are justified in requesting additional construction observation fees to cover our additional work required due to PDA extending HK's contract 140 days.

The amount requested in previous requests for construction observation was approximately \$21,000 to be paid hourly based on actual work. We have attached a summary of our work to date and a new estimate for the work required to complete the project.

In summary, we are requesting additional fees, because PDA extended the contract by 140 days. Since we must be on the job when the Contractor works, we need additional fees to cover our costs.


